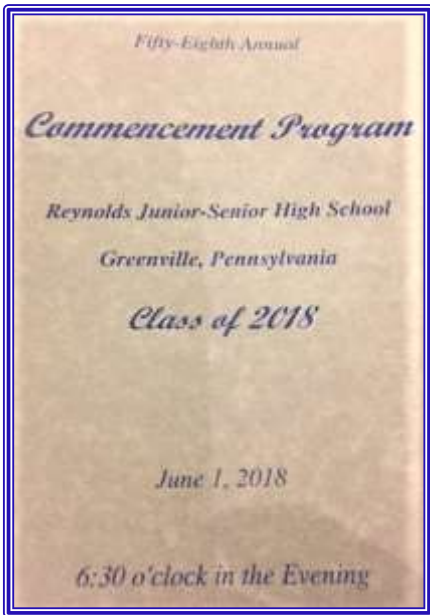

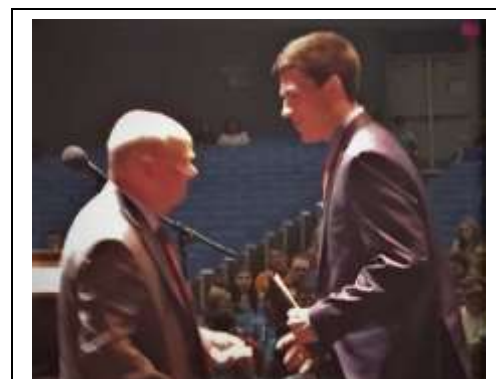

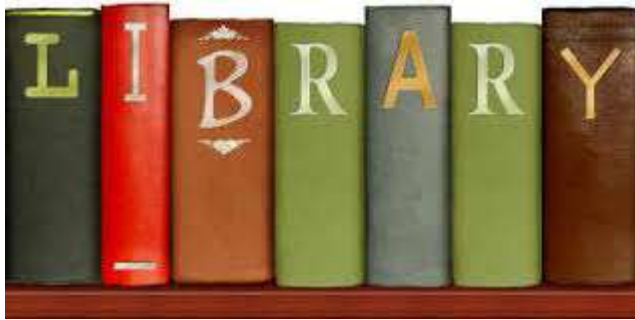
MRS. MARYANN TOFANI

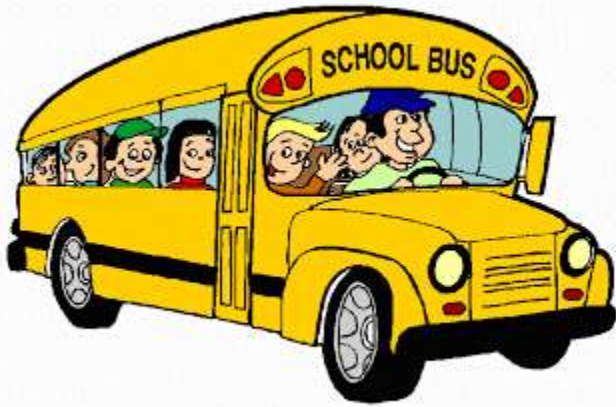

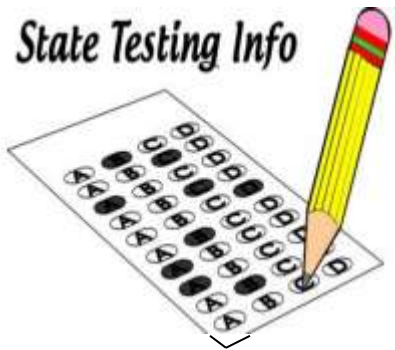
