


# **Success by Six Program**

MORTGAGE STATEMENT, LEASE AGREEMENT, CELL PHONE STATEMENT, OR TWO (2) CURRENT UTILITY BILLS, VERIFICATION OF SOCIAL SERVICES) AND A COMPLETE IMMUNIZATION RECORD. COMPLETE IMMUNIZATION MEANS THE CHILD HAS RECEIVED ALL DOSES OF REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS:






### Mr. Seth Little, Biology

### A NOTE FROM THE NURSES...

#### **Important Information for All Parents and Guardians**

The PA Department of Health added new requirements for attendance at school which affected all students this school year. All students, who have not met the requirement, will need:

- a 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of MCV (meningococcal conjugate vaccine) for all students entering 12<sup>th</sup> grade, which must be given after their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday;
- a dose of polio given on or after their 4<sup>th</sup> birthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose for students in all grades.

Please contact your student's doctor as they may have already had these vaccines and/or to schedule an appointment to receive these vaccines and provide documentation of the date these vaccines were given to the school nurse before the first day of the **2018-19** school year.

Please feel free to contact the school nurse as needed.
