## PROJECT

*The Veteran's Memorial Ad Hoc committee has been meeting throughout the 2012-13 school year for the purpose of establishing a permanent memorial/monument, on Reynolds District property, honoring both living and deceased veterans of our country.*

The monument will be installed on a pentagon shaped cement slab with walkways radiating out toward existing walkways. In addition, individual brick pavers, as donated by the public, will be installed in close proximity to the memorial.*

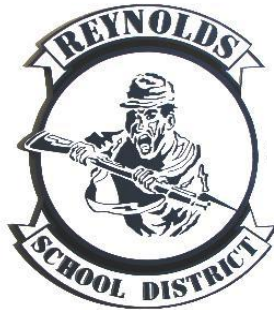
