Re: COVID-19 Return to In-Person Instruction

Dear Reynolds Families,

Last night the Board officially approved the return to in-person instruction. This letter provides the details surrounding the return to in-person instruction and continuation of our virtual program.

All students may return to in-person instruction on January 19th. In-person instruction will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. In-person instruction students will complete schoolwork at home on Wednesday.

Students that wish to remain in virtual instruction may do so. These students should log in to Google Classroom to receive posted lessons on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. On Wednesdays, virtual instruction students will participate in Live Online Instruction and should follow their class schedule. This time will be dedicated to receiving real-time support from teachers.

Challenges Ahead

This return to in-person instruction comes with challenges. Reynolds' return to in-person instruction is subject to the <u>November 24, 2020 Order</u> from the Secretary of Health. Under Section 2(B) of this Order, Reynolds must comply with the <u>Recommendations for Pre-K to 12 Schools Following Identification of a Case(s) of COVID-19</u> when the District is providing in-person instruction in a county with substantial transmission. Accordingly, the District will implement the attached chart if COVID-19 cases enter our buildings.

As you will see, as few as two COVID-19 cases in 14 days can cause a building to close for 3-7 days. This time may be shortened if case investigations and contact tracing can be completed in a faster time frame. Unfortunately, assistance from the Department of Health has been very slow or nonexistent.

As of this letter, Mercer County remains in the "Substantial" category of transmission of COVID-19. Families may want to develop a plan in case intermittent closures are required. If the District must take this undesired step, the affected students and staff will transition to full-remote learning for as short a time as possible.

Staffing restrictions may also cause these closures. Reynolds teachers and staff members that contract the virus or are close contacts must quarantine. Reynolds will exhaust all appropriate staffing solutions to cover these challenges. Despite these efforts, additional short-term virtual instruction may be required.

To prevent this unwelcomed disruption, all students and staff must follow the daily screening tool. Any student or staff member that meets the criteria on the form must stay home. Another copy of the screening tool is attached for your convenience.

I welcome the opportunity to see our students back in school. I hope you will all join our efforts to follow the rules that will allow us to continue to deliver in-person instruction for the remainder of the year. Thank you for your efforts and patience this year.

Your child must stay home if you or your child

You child must stay home if your child has been in contact with someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past 14 days even if your child has no symptoms.

If your child meets these criteria when they arrive at school, they will be quarantined and sent home immediately.
