Reynolds School District Health and Safety Plan 2020-2021

1. Introduction

While we all look forward to our 2020-2021 school year, the current COVID-19 pandemic does not allow us to return without changes. Though it is not possible to eliminate all risk of spreading COVID-19, current research suggests there are many steps schools can take to reduce the risks to students, staff, and their families. This plan outlines Reynolds School District's recommendations to minimize the spread of the virus based on federal, state, and local guidance and orders. While the District will take steps to increase the safety of students and staff, the individual behavior of each participant is the key to a successful return. Each student, parent, and staff member should familiarize themselves with this plan and CDC guidance to minimize the spread of COVID-19.

1.1 Return to Traditional Instruction

The Reynolds School District Pandemic Team unanimously agrees that a return to the traditional 5-day schedule where all students attend school for in-person instruction is the best means of delivering education. RSD plans to return to this traditional instruction model as soon as feasible.

Unfortunately, our facilities do not allow RSD to return to full attendance while complying with Pennsylvania's face covering and social distancing mandates. As soon as it is possible to safely educate and feed Reynolds' entire student population, the District will return to traditional instruction. While we anxiously await that time, the following plan aims to provide a stable platform of virtual instruction that arms the District with the skillset to withstand any challenges the 2020-2021 school year may present.

1.2 The Coronavirus and its impact on Reopening Schools

The newly identified coronavirus, SARS-CoV-2 has caused a worldwide pandemic of a respiratory illness called COVID-19. COVID-19 symptoms include cough, fever, shortness of breath, muscle aches, sore throat, unexplained loss of taste or smell, diarrhea, and headache. COVID-19 can be severe, and some cases have caused death. The virus is thought to spread mainly from person to person via close contact with one another and through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks. The virus presents unique challenges to reopening schools. To combat the spread of the virus, Reynolds School District (RSD) recommends following all federal, state, and local guidelines and recommendations to the greatest extent feasible while still providing quality education. These guidelines are constantly changing as new information and treatments become available. Accordingly, this plan will be adjusted as needed as information becomes available to decrease the risk of exposure for our students and staff. The most current version of this plan will be available on the Reynolds School District website.

2. Type of Reopening

Reynolds will begin the 2020-2021 school year via Live Online Learning. Under this model, teachers and students will interact through real-time instruction five days a week on a District provided device. District staff will deliver instruction from their classroom while students receive instruction from home.

The Board of Directors will review the reopening method and this Health and Safety Plan on or before the end of the first nine-week grading period. At that time, the Board of Directors, in consultation with the Pandemic Team, will decide if students will return to in-person instruction or remain online.

3. Pandemic Team

Plan Development: Individual will play a role in drafting the enclosed Health and Safety Plan;

Pandemic Crisis Response Team: Individual will play a role in within-year decision making regarding response efforts in the event of a confirmed positive case or exposure among staff and students; or

Both (Plan Development and Response Team): Individual will play a role in drafting the plan and within-year decision making regarding response efforts in the event of confirmed positive case.

4. Cleaning, Sanitizing, Disinfecting, and Ventilation

Summary: Reynolds maintenance and custodial staff will clean and sanitize all District facilities in accordance with CDC guidelines provided in <u>Guidance for Cleaning and Disinfecting</u>. All RSD staff should review this guidance and familiarize themselves with the procedures contained within it. Checklists to confirm each cleaning task should be developed for each District facility. Training regarding this protocol and the CDC guidelines should be completed before the school year begins.

5. Social Distancing and Other Safety Protocols

Summary:

Reynolds School District will begin the 2020-2021 school year via Live Online Learning for all students. Teachers and staff will continue to report to the school to deliver live real-time instruction. Students will participate in Live Online Learning at home. Despite the online learning model, the District will still implement the following social distancing and other safety protocols to mitigate the virus spread.

Summary: Reynolds will monitor students, staff, and others who interact with each other to ensure they are healthy and not exhibiting signs of illness. Despite delivering instruction via Live Online Learning students and staff will still have opportunities to interact and spread the virus. The following measures should be implemented to limit the spread.
