Reynolds School District Health and Safety Plan 2020-2021 Revised November 18, 2020

1. Introduction

1.1 Return to In-Person Instruction

The Reynolds School District is excited for the return of students. This plan returns to a traditional 5-day schedule where all students attend school for in-person instruction. Families that wish to continue with full-virtual instruction will continue to have this option.

A return to in-person instruction for 2020-2021 school year must come with some changes. Though it is not possible to eliminate all risk of spreading COVID-19, current research suggests there are many steps schools can take to reduce the risks to students, staff, and their families. This plan outlines Reynolds School District's recommendations to minimize the spread of the virus based on federal, state, and local guidance and orders. While the District will take steps to increase the safety of students and staff, the individual behavior of each participant is the key to a successful return. Each student, parent, and staff member must familiarize themselves with this plan and CDC guidance to minimize the spread of COVID-19 and ensure a successful return to in-person instruction.

Reynolds may also need to alter its mode of instruction to respond to the challenges presented by the pandemic. Regardless of the mode of instruction, the District shall implement this Health and Safety Plan. The following plan represents Reynolds's best efforts to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 given the current research and recommendations. The Board of Directors will edit this plan if the Pennsylvania Department of Education, Pennsylvania Department of Health, or other appropriate governing body develops new recommendations or guidance that impact the Reynolds school community.

1.2 The Coronavirus and its impact on Reopening Schools

The coronavirus, SARS-CoV-2 has caused a worldwide pandemic of a respiratory illness called COVID-19. COVID-19 symptoms include cough, fever, shortness of breath, muscle aches, sore throat, unexplained loss of taste or smell, diarrhea, and headache. COVID-19 can be severe, and some cases have caused death. The virus is thought to spread

mainly from person to person via close contact with one another and through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks.

The virus presents unique challenges to reopening schools. To combat the spread of the virus, Reynolds School District (RSD) recommends following all federal, state, and local guidelines and recommendations to the greatest extent feasible while still providing quality education. These guidelines are constantly changing as new information and treatments become available. Accordingly, this plan will be adjusted as information becomes available to decrease the risk of exposure for our students and staff. The most current version of this plan will be available on the Reynolds School District website.

2. Type of Reopening

RSD will return students to the classroom for 5-days a week starting on November 2, 2020.

Families that wish to remain in a full virtual environment will continue to have the option to do so. Virtual education students will continue to log into Google classrooms for recorded lessons and assignments. Each days recorded lessons will be available by 4:00 p.m. and must be watched by 4:00 p.m. the next day. If the lesson is not watched the student will be marked absent.

The Board of Directors will review the reopening method and this Health and Safety Plan on or before the end of each nine-week grading period.

3. Pandemic Team

4. Cleaning, Sanitizing, Disinfecting, and Ventilation

Summary: RSD maintenance and custodial staff will clean and sanitize all RSD facilities in accordance with CDC guidelines provided in <u>Guidance for Cleaning and Disinfecting</u>. To protect the health and safety of our staff, RSD will alter the guidance to allow for disinfecting before cleaning. The CDC has reviewed and approved this change. Checklists to confirm each cleaning task should be developed for each District facility. All maintenance and custodial staff will be trained regarding RSD's cleaning and disinfecting protocol and the CDC guidelines before students return to in-person instruction.

Despite delivering instruction via Live Online Learning students and staff will still have opportunities to interact and spread the virus.
